Recognizing Oregon's History

Oregon has a long history of strengths-based family team decision meeting practice that is collaborative, family focused and geared to help children and families with mental health challenges and child safety issues.

So, why Wraparound?

Wraparound is a planning process that integrates and builds on the principles of family team meetings, by:

- ✓ Empowering families to make well-informed plans for their children.
- ✓ Bringing together all systems involved in a child and family's life to create a coordinated single plan of care.



- ✓ Committing to shared responsibility and accountability to the planning process.
- ✓ Providing a process that is proven to work. Wraparound is recognized as a promising practice in children's mental health and is currently on the State of Oregon's list of Evidence-Based Practices.

- ✓ Providing individualized services to meet the unique needs of the child and family.
- ✓ Generating statewide interest in the adoption of targeted goals and action steps to begin the implementation of a Statewide Children's Wraparound Initiative.
- ✓ Recognizing that safety is a primary issue and building plans to ensure everyone's safety.

Long-term outcomes

- Placements for children in their communities if a return home is not possible.
- Improved mental health outcomes for youth and caregiver.
- Improved functioning in school/vocation and community.
- Workforce training and development.
- Development of a strong family organization.
- Systems-wide improvements at the local, provider and state levels.
- Program specific outcomes.
- Achievement of team mission.
- Develops increased resources for child and family.
- Improved resiliency and quality of life.

Who is eligible to receive services and support through Wraparound Oregon?

Early Childhood Wraparound	School-age Wraparound
Children from birth – 8 yrs.	Children from 7 – 18 yrs.
Children and their families who live in Multnomah County.	Children and their families who live in Multnomah County.
<p>Children who are eligible or may be eligible for for Early Intervention or Early Childhood Special Education, and are involved in two or more child serving systems where there is service fragmentation</p> <p>Children who may be at risk for out of home placement, or already placed outside the home</p>	<p>Children who are involved in two or more child-serving systems such as child welfare, special education, mental health, juvenile justice and/or Oregon Youth Authority</p> <p>Children who are in residential or institutional care or who are at risk of higher level of care</p>
Children who are diagnosed, or have a diagnosable mental health or co-occurring disorders.	Children who have severe emotional or behavioral disorders and who have co-occurring disorders (substance abuse, developmental disabilities, physical health conditions)
